Below is an excerpt from a letter we received from Dr Richard Corkish, Head of the School of Photovoltaic and Renewable energy Engineering, UNSW in regard to our assistance. ARS would like to thank Dr Corkish, Eden and his team for allowing us to be part of this project, it is very gratifying to know that our team contributed, albeit in a small way, to improving the lives of the Imaki people.

"I am writing to thank you very much for your donation to support our Imaki, Tanna Island, Vanuatu project. The group from UNSW, led by Eden Tehan, installed a second micro-hydro generator, integrated with that installed in 2009. Together, they now provide reliable electricity to the clinic and the regional primary and secondary schools in the village. The clinic is now lit and its refrigerator now operates from that sustainable and affordable hydro resource, saving the expense and greenhouse impact of its LPG-powered predecessor.

Thanks for helping us realise our project and for improving the lives of the Imaki people and, perhaps, to create a model for other Vanuatu villages."
